It impacts youth regardless of gender, sexual orientation, ethnicity, socioeconomic status, and age. It's crucial for providers working with youth and young adults to learn about commercial sexual exploitation. "An Overview of Commercial Sexual Exploitation" will introduce you to the topic by talking about federal legislation, whether or not youth choose to be involved in the commercial sex industry, risk factors for being exploited, and the impact of involvement in the industry. Providers will also learn about the resiliency of survivors and an overview of ways to support survivors on their healing journey.
