Complicated Spiritual Grief: When Grief Becomes a Spiritual Crisis

For many grieving individuals, faith, religion, and spirituality of fer solace and strength in the aftermath of loss. These spiritual frameworks often help people make sense of their grief and provide a foundation for healing. However, for some, the grieving process disrupts — or even severs — their connection to a higher power, spiritual identity, or religious community. This rupture can result in a secondary loss: the loss of spiritual support, meaning, and belonging, which may lead to a profound spiritual crisis. This form of suffering is known as Complicated Spiritual Grief (CSG) — a state in which the individual's spiritual or religious foundation is deeply impacted by loss. CSG can intensify the emotional pain of bereavement, especially for those who have previously drawn strength from spiritual or religious beliefs.

Clinicians are increasingly encountering spiritual and religious concerns in their therapeutic work with grieving clients. This workshop equips mental health professionals with the knowledge and tools to recognize the signs and impact of CSG. Participants will learn to assess the presence of spiritual distress, understand how CSG can influence the mourning process, and develop effective, spiritually sensitive treatment plans. By addressing all domains of the grieving client's experience — emotional, cognitive, behavioral, and spiritual — clinicians will be better prepared to support holistic healing in the face of loss.
